INTRODUCTION

Make Our Schools Safe ("MOSS") is a 501(c)3 national non-profit organization dedicated to protecting students and teachers at school. Our mission is to empower students and staff to help create and maintain a culture of safety and vigilance in a secure school environment.

Born out of the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School massacre on Valentine's Day 2018, when our founders lost their beautiful 14-year-old daughter, Alyssa Alhadeff, we are here to strengthen the weaknesses in school security. Parkland's shooting did not have to happen. We are here to take action, protecting schools so it never happens again. With passion and persistence, it can be done!

Our foundation collaborates with high-level security advisors to offer survival information for protection in emergencies. We are focused on bringing these skills to schools so teachers feel confident to protect their students and themselves. Scenariobased training must be as intrinsic a part of schooling as fire drills.

As we ramp up, we will provide Dream Team Club tool kits, empowering others to collaborate with local government to impact school safety. It's literally life-or-death-level important that our administrators consider school safety as essential as they do the curriculum.

SUMMARY OF PROGRAMS AND ACCOMPLISHMENT



Alyssa's Law is critical legislation addressing the issue of law enforcement response time when a life-threatening emergency occurs because time equals life.

The law calls for the installation of silent panic alarms that are directly linked to law enforcement, so in case of any emergency, they will get on the scene as quickly as possible, take down a threat, and triage any victims. Every moment matters in emergency situations, and now each precious second will count for more. Each second will be more powerful.

So far, Alyssa's Law has passed in New Jersey and Florida, and as of June 24, 2022, it passed in New York. In May 2023, Alyssa's Law was passed in Texas and Tennessee.

We know that Alyssa is celebrating our victory with us, happy that we have succeeded in making schools safer for all children throughout Florida. Her legacy will continue on, forever tied to such a vital piece of legislation that will transform and save the lives of so many.

The work continues to pass Alyssa's Law at a federal level so that our students are protected nationally. We won't rest until we see our mission through!

MOSS CLUBS

The Make Our Schools Safe (MOSS) Club is an in-school, oncampus club comprised of motivated and school-safetyminded students. All club members have the same goal: to create a culture of school safety. These club members are the voice of the MOSS movement. The empowerment of today's youth is the best chance we have to make necessary changes in the world. As Make Our Schools Safe founder Lori Alhadeff so passionately says, "Your voice is your power!"

Each club has its own elected officers to help organize and execute meetings and activities. Clubs meet on school grounds approximately once every two weeks. The club provides an inclusive, welcoming forum for all students to participate and have a voice to maintain a culture of school safety and vigilance in a secure school environment.

Each chapter is expected to meet with school officials regularly in order to maintain transparency within the club and the community with regard to school safety measures throughout the school year. During the 2022–2023 school year, MOSS had a total of 23 clubs throughout the country, and for the 2023–2024 school year.

A strong emphasis is also placed on community service projects to help those in need. Paying it forward is essential to the Make Our Schools Safe Club culture.



During early 2023, five students from the Pompano Beach High School Make Our Schools Safe Club traveled to Washington, D.C., to compete in the nationwide Invent2Prevent competition! Invent2Prevent is an innovative, experiential learning program that challenges high school and college students to create and implement their own dynamic products, tools, or initiatives to address acts of targeted violence, hate, or terrorism in their specific communities. Teams compete at the high school level for awards of \$5,000 for first place, \$3,000 for second place, and \$1,000 for third place.

Our group had the opportunity to present more about their school safety project to a panel of Department of Homeland Security executives, subject experts, and esteemed academics. Their initiative, known as "Bonding Buddies", aimed to eliminate social isolation and foster relationships amongst Pompano Beach Elementary School youth by pairing older students with younger ones as mentors. After presenting to a panel of industry experts, Pompano Beach MOSS Club earned the title of 2nd in the nation!
